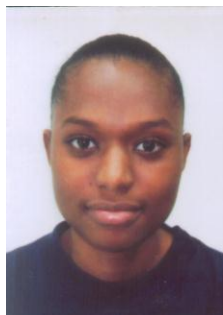

SHANNON R. STANLEY – Modern Studies Additional



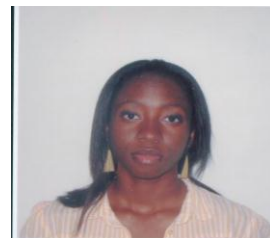
